This Sunday will be my last week at St. Johns for several months as next Sunday (15th) I start my first ministry placement.

I have to undertake 80 hours of supervised training, and 30 unsupervised hours in a parish outside my own, and as a result I am going to serve under the Rev'd Diane Hayward-Wright at Cookhill, and the parish of Inkberrow. During this time I will take an active role in the ministerial leadership of the church, be trained in how to serve as a deacon and take part in church life and activities in this parish. At the end of the training I will then have to produce a report on one aspect of mission and write a case study on a pastoral situation I have been involved in.

The parish of Inkberrow is very different to St John's as it is a rural parish and has 4 churches within it. I will mainly be serving at the churches at Cookhill and Inkberrow during the placement, but will also take part in leading some services at Kington and Dormston. The worship tradition is generally more formal and liturgical than the more informal style of worship at St. John's, and they celebrate the Eucharist most weeks. Therefore the placement is going to offer me many new things to observe and learn to support my training.

I am naturally quite excited and nervous about the time ahead, partly as this will be the first time I have worshipped anywhere outside of St Johns for any length of time since 1988 when I first moved to Redditch. I therfore ask for the churches prayer support throughout my placement and during this new stage of my ministerial journey. Megan will continue to attend St John's while I am away, so I also ask that people continue to pray for, and support, both Megan and Bob during this time, for which I am very grateful.

I send my love and best wishes to you all for the forthcoming months, and look forward to worshipping with you again sometime after Christmas. *God Bless. Allison*
