Support for the Kigezi Water & Sanitation Project

On 5th January we announced that St John's church has pledged £1000 p/a to the Kigezi Diocese Water & Sanitation project which operates in the hilly Kabale District of SW Uganda. The money will be sent through Tearfund to be used in their Connected Church programme. A number of churches in the UK have pledged over £50k for this project which will help people living in rural areas of Kigezi Diocese obtain clean safe water for drinking, improve sanitation, HIV education and practical support to the communities affected. The churches in Kigezi play a direct part in the project and provide training in agriculture, environmental conservation, health and hygiene education. The project has already helped provide rainwater tanks, water pipes and taps. This has improved the health and livelihoods of many people and allowed more children to attend schools regularly. St John's supported another water project 15 years ago in Uganda, when we helped fund wells in Bulenge, in the Busoga Diocese, so its really good news that we are able to give to churches in another part of Uganda to provide safe clean water to local communities.

Dear friends and family,

A very happy new year to you.

This morning we received the results of the scan Denise had just before Christmas and I am delighted to report good news. Praise God, the tumour has continued to shrink since her previous scan in October. We are hugely thankful: it is a real answer to prayer and we are immensely grateful for all the prayer that has been offered. If you like numbers, the dimensions in August were 14.2 by 9.4 by 10; in October they were 11.1 by 8.5 by 8.1 and then in December 10.7 by 7.5 by 6.3 - all centimetres. As you see from these figures, the shrinkage has been considerable but the sarcoma is still large and much prayer is still needed.

The oncologist is not proposing any further chemotherapy at present, about which we are very relieved. He will review the situation with another scan in three months' time and we hope and pray that it will have shrunk very significantly by then. In the meantime, Denise continues to feel much better as the debilitating effects of chemo fade – so much so that we were able, last minute, to book a bargain week in the sun in the Canary Islands after Christmas. Having not been able to take a family holiday last year it was wonderful to be able to relax together in the sun for a week.

Thank you so much for all your prayer which has carried us through this last very testing year. It really has had a tangible effect and we would be so grateful if you were able to continue to pray in the months ahead.
