Pentecost

However, over the first few decades of the church, this feast took on a new meaning: Jesus has risen and ascended to the Father, but he promised us his Spirit. So today we rejoice that the Spirit is moving in each of our hearts making us a people, inspiring us to understand the mystery of our faith, and strengthening us to follow Jesus the Anointed One.

The focus of Pentecost is as a celebration of, and a thanksgiving for, the presence and focus of the Spirit in our lives. As Christians, the Spirit, dwells within and activates the church. The Spirit unites the church, then inspires them and sends them forth to be the witnesses to Jesus to the ends of the earth.
