Thought for the week

Are you feeling brave and courageous for God today? Well, if the truth were known, very few of us feel like that all the time. However, there are times when God calls us to step up for our faith, just like Amos did in the Old Testament, and John the Baptist did in the New.

Words like courage and risk and confronting the abuse of power don't come easily to peace-loving people, but we need to ask the question:

'What is the Christ-like response to dishonesty, untruthfulness and the mis-use of power?' Of course, Jesus wants us to follow him, and be ready to speak out about these things, rather than simply ignore them. If we believe that real authority and power have their source in God, then we need to be prepared to be strong, and 'speak truth unto power.' This does not need to be militant or aggressive, but peaceful and persuasive, and, as one prayer phrases it: 'Go and be a speaker of truth, an empowerer of the voiceless, and a protector of the vulnerable, in Jesus' name. Amen.'
