

> News from St John's Sunday 18th October 2015

Dear St John's Church family,

What does it mean to have fellowship with one another? I find it easier to define evangelism, teaching and outreach as functions of the church, but it is more difficult to define fellowship.

Fellowship is all about heart attitude. We might have a formal (or informal) fellowship meeting in our programme, but whether or not real fellowship takes place depends on our heart attitude. In the early church, the fellowship was closely intertwined with "Fellowship Meals" during which the breaking of bread was a part. The fellowship meal offered an opportunity for those blessed with more to share their abundance with others, and for me this is not only worldly goods, but spiritual blessings also. This sharing is an essential part of the love and concern that make up true fellowship. (acts2:41-42,44-47; 4:34-35) This fellowship was threatened in the Jerusalem Church when complaints arose over the distribution of food to the widows in the church. This problem was quickly taken care of and remains to show us that this church cared for those in its body that were in need. Jesus said, "they will know you are my disciples by the love you share with one another.

Question when you come together this morning, what have you brought to share with others? And what do you hope to receive?
