News from St John's Sunday 3rd January 2016

On Christmas morning Rosie spoke about the missing person from our Christmas crib sets. Joseph, often overlooked in the story, and after the presentation in the temple, no longer mentioned except in passing reference. However, we can learn a few important lessons from Joseph as we stand at the beginning of a new year. The thing we remember about Joseph is that he heard the angel's words and acted in obedience. Let's look at the background to this.

When he learned of Mary's pregnancy he wanted to do the right thing. Right thing? What was the right thing. Exposing her "shame," so she could be stoned to death, or divorcing her in a society where a divorced woman was the subject of ridicule and shame and dishonour. Either way Joseph would do the right thing, but Mary would pay the price of her obedience to God.

Joseph needed to hear God for himself, and must respond in humility and obedience. It wasn't about him, but Jesus. In his dilemma he did not pay attention to this special child. It was only the angel coming and pointing this out. The flight to Egypt was also about preserving the child.

In this New Year, with the plans we have, let us seek God's will, for ourselves, for our families and for the Church. IT may not always be what others would call the "right way". But it will be God's way, and in this way lies God's blessing.
