

News from St John's – Notices 22<sup>nd</sup> May 2016

Today is Trinity Sunday. It is the only Sunday or feast day in the church's calendar which is named after a bit of church teaching and doctrine, rather than an event in the life of Jesus. It's very much on its own, and understanding what it means took the early church several centuries. So we talk about one God: we believe in one God. And we also talk about God the Father, God the Son and God the Holy Spirit - but still only one God. What does it mean and why does it matter? Well it matters, perhaps above all in this day and age, what sort of God we believe in.

I say perhaps above all in this day and age because we have plenty of evidence of what bad religion can do in the world around us today. A false picture of God can lead to all sorts of false practice of religion – a brutal and vengeful God makes for a brutal and vengeful religion.

So what sort of God He is really does matter - that's one reason why doctrine and theology (teaching and talking about God) plays a big part in the Christian life. For the Christian this Sunday highlights what sort of God we believe in: whenever you say the Apostles or Nicene Creed in church you are fleshing out the doctrine of the Trinity.

What we believe about God is that He is the creator of the whole world, and he even made us in his own image and likeness. How amazing is that! He is as He is in Jesus, so there is hope: if you want to see God, point people to Jesus. And He is ever present, deeply within us and for us here and now.

I like to think of it this way. That at the heart of God is a community of love between the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit: this community of love beckons us to join and belong. It is this for which we are made – life in communion with Christians down the centuries and around the world, life in communion with the God who created, redeems us and loves us.
