Dear All,

Last week we took a first look at how St John's could invest through prayer in the mission of the Church in our own Diocese of Worcester.

Today we consider the second area of investment in the mission of the Church, in Worcestershire and Dudley. Any mission requires resourcing. To provide these resources requires a financial investment. The Diocese provides priests and lay ministers to undertake the task of mission. The Diocese also provides expertise, and support in specific areas, and training for those already in ministry. Because the Diocese provides ministry, there is a church in every area of the diocese. There is mission and outreach in every place, made possible by this deployment. All of this requires money to fund.

St John's invests in this mission and ministry in the Diocese through the parish share. The Parish Share is a large part of our budget. It is not a tax on the Church, but our sharing in providing ministers, ministry and mission to this area. By our parish share we are part of the missionary work of the Diocese. Maybe our parish share is larger than the costs of ministers in this parish, but it all goes to provide ministry in the parish of Ipsley and in other parishes not able to support their own ministry.
