Dear all,

Nobody could have accused Jesus of deceiving those who would follow Him, that everything would be rosy. He repeatedly warned them that by following Him closely, would bring them hardship and suffering. The future He was calling them to was not to be entered into by those who were unwilling to complete the race.

In the Church Times newspaper this week appears an article about Hidden Japanese Christians. A study into the early Christian movement in Japan when new believers were forced to hide underground for fear of extreme persecution. In today's world the persecution is fiercer than at any other time in our history.

In Luke 14.25-33, Jesus speaks of counting the cost of discipleship. The aim is not just to count the cost, but also to be willing to pay the cost of following Jesus. Paul wrote to Timothy that all who seek to live godly lives in Christ Jesus, will suffer, for this willingness.

Jesus' promises to those who count the cost and find themselves still willing to answer the call and follow Him, are 1] His grace that is sufficient for us in all circumstances. And 2] "to him / her who overcomes, I will give the crown of life."
