Dear All,

I believe we are at an incredible time in history. Not only are we facing a world that is increasingly hostile to the Christian Faith, but there is also an agenda of darkness that, though foreseen and we are warned about in scripture, has been both ignored and largely forgotten in our time.

Scripture foretold of a last-days religiousness that prides itself in knowledge but deeply resists the truth. I believe that it is a form of doctrine that shifts its focus from a dependence on God to a dependence on human skill and effort.

# Service on 20th November

There will be a Parish service on Sunday morning 20<sup>th</sup> November to celebrate Christ The King. We observe Christ the King on the last Sunday after Pentecost, which is also the last Sunday of the Christian year and the Sunday before the new year begins with Advent.
