

Financial Update October 2016-

Thank you to all who have made donations towards replacing the Central heating boiler in church, Currently the total given towards this project is £4185, which includes donations parish wide and Gift Aid Donations. Also the Diocese have agreed to give us a loan of £5000 for the boiler (which we will be aiming to repay over the next 2 years).

We should be able to fully fund the boiler replacement and our existing commitments for this year.

However our bank balances are forecast to go down by about £2500 by the end of December. This would give Year End Bank balances of around £7000. (which is about half of what we should have for healthy operation).

Our financial situation for 2017 is more uncertain. Following our redoing the Fairer Share Survey we are expecting a reduction in our payments from January 2017, but we will not know by how much until December.
