Christmas message from Bishop Graham

The school nativity play where everything goes wrong must be every teacher's nightmare. The innkeeper who says 'come in' instead of 'there's no room'. Joseph standing on Mary's toe and making her cry. The angels who look very grumpy as they sing 'Glory to God in the highest'. The king who won't hand over his present.

The reality of the first Christmas is that it wasn't perfect. In fact, it was full of messiness.

The stable would not have been the cleanest, tidiest or most fragrant of places. Mary's pregnancy was a surprise and Joseph risked ridicule. The shepherds, seen as unclean people at that time, were not the obvious choice for the first visitors. King Herod guaked as to what these events could mean for the uneasy politics of his day. Then Jesus' family were soon to find themselves refugees in a foreign land.

Into all of this messiness, God comes.

God continues to do that. He sends Jesus to be with us.

Sends Jesus so that we might meet him in the untidy places of our lives.

Sends Jesus to be with families that are struggling.

Sends Jesus to be with those on the margins of society.

Sends Jesus to be with us in political uncertainty.

Sends Jesus to be with refugees fleeing from oppression and war. God sends Jesus to be present in the messiness of life.

And what does Jesus bring?
