

Dear All.

Carrying on the series of thoughts on "Forgiving God." The third reason, we should totally forgive God because of how we will feel on that final day when God clears His name. God the Father is the most maligned person in the universe He made. What He does and doesn't do at times makes no sense at all. But when He vindicates himself, He will do it perfectly, before all people who ever lived. Before the angels. Before the devil and all the evil powers. If someone has not forgiven God, their lives are often filled with self-righteousness and a feeling of entitlement – that God owes us an answer for the evil things He allows. It would be very foolish to blame God for the problem of evil, simply because God allows suffering. Like Job we could be crying out to know the reason why, choosing to blame God for our misfortune and calamity and demanding and answer. God promises to clear His name, but in His own time.
