We welcome Toyona today, mom Donna and their family for Toyona's Baptism, it is lovely to have you all with us, we hope you enjoy the morning service and celebration.

"Death is but the next great adventure". So says Professor Dumbledore to Harry Potter. ... and last week my own father started on that adventure. While he didn't want to leave us, he also couldn't wait to get started. He was looking forward to meeting Jesus, and had been for many years, once telling a dying Christian friend that he was jealous he would get to meet Jesus first. Three days before he died we shared a very special time, with him seeing things we couldn't and saying

"Hallelujah". He insisted that we join hands and say together "Thank you Jesus. We love you". It was very beautiful and reassuring.

But many do not die with experiences like this. Dumbledore also says "It is the unknown we fear when we look upon death and darkness, nothing more". We all have people we love who have not seen death as the start of a new, exciting adventure with God..... people whose faith was uncertain.....and even for those of us who do believe, death still leads to the unknown which can be very frightening.

As we approach our service of hope and remembrance on Wednesday, I believe we can do no better than to look at all this through the lens of Christ, who always welcomed everyone, however uncertain or frightened or lost they might be. The life beyond death is unknown, but we can trust God with it, for us and our loved ones. As the psalmist says, there is nowhere we can go to escape his love.

If I go up to the heavens, you are there;

if I make my bed in the depths, you are there.... even there your hand will guide me,

ren inere your nand will guide me,

your right hand will hold me fast. (Psalm 139)

And the God who is the 'resurrection and the life' calls us all to join him on that next, great adventure. I will miss Daddy so much, and I'm sure the missing will get worse as it starts to become more real, but I know that he is having a wonderful time, adventuring with his Jesus at last!
