1. If you are worried about a homeless person use StreetLink this is a charity who will get in touch with organisations who will go out and speak with the person. You can leave your details if you wish and you will be updated on the outcome of the contact.

- 2. <u>Donate food to the foodbank</u> bring items into church for ongoing transportation to the storage facility for Redditch Food Bank. To help ensure there is sufficient storage, please donate items where possible from the list given out by the Foodbank. You can also donate at the Town Hall or Tesco.
- 3. If you strike up a conversation with a homeless person, direct them during the day to Redditch Borough Council reception at Walter Stranz Square, adjacent to The Palace Theatre. There are trained staff available to help assess a persons needs and help people to make steps to coming off the streets.

The charity fights child poverty and neglect and helps all children they are in touch with have a better chance in life. Over 13,000 children and young people were helped last year they also helped to bring about 27 national and regional policy changes.
