The ascension of Jesus Christ is one of the most significant events recorded in the New Testament. Ascension Day marks the 40th day of Easter, and commemorates Jesus Christ's ascension into heaven following his death and resurrection, as recorded in the passages found in Luke 24:50-51 and Acts 1:8-11.

Jesus appears to the disciples in His glorified state after rising from the dead. Jesus then encourages His disciples that they will "receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you." He tells them that they must serve as His "witnesses in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth."

Immediately after these words are spoken, the ascension takes place: "He was taken up before their very eyes, and a cloud hid him from their sight. They were looking intently up into the sky as He was going, when suddenly two men dressed in white stood beside them. 'Men of Galilee,' they said, 'why do you stand here looking into the sky? This same Jesus, who has been taken from you into heaven, will come back in the same way you have seen him go into heaven.'"

Christ's ascension into Heaven marked the crowning event of His exaltation, and served as a necessary event to His continuing work through the Spirit and the church.

Having paid the ultimate price for the sin of humanity-death on the cross-Jesus Christ is now risen and exalted and applies the salvation He has won by granting the gifts of repentance and forgiveness of sins. Thus, Ascension Day is significant because it provides believers with the hope of Christ's return and proclaims the hope and glory held out to all who are in Christ.

Have you received the great salvation that Jesus offers? This Ascension Day we can thank God for the finished work of His son, the Holy Spirit's presence in our lives, and the promise of Christ's return.
