Lent Reflection

Those of you who are following our Lent course using the Lent with New Daylight have read this week of the significance of places. We have read of Abraham, Joshua, Moses and Isaiah all of whom together with all the prophets had memorable experiences.

Ranging from a burning bush to the world's first cairn when each tribe of Israel carried a stone across the river Jordan and placed them to form a pyramid. We can all remember our first church and how long we worshipped there. However which of our spiritual highs do we remember and are indelibly engraved in our memories?

I have been fortunate to visit Israel twice and on one visit we were taken out in a boat to cross Lake Galilee. When we reached the middle of the lake the boatman without any warning switched off the engine so that we could experience a profound calm which Jesus' disciples experienced after Jesus calmed the storm. I have never felt so much at peace.

Except for another time at Ffald-y Brenin, a Christian retreat centre in Pembrokeshire. Jill and I had gone there for a few days with the intention of getting close to God in prayer for healing of Jill's cancer. One evening we were in the beautiful chapel. There was only one lit candle. After we had prayed for a while we became aware that the chapel was flooded with light, I looked up to the skylight and saw the most beautiful bright full moon you could imagine. I am sure it was God's way of saying although things look bleak I will shine my light into your lives.

Is there a memorable place in your lives you can return to where you called on the Lord? Also why do you think certain places echo our spiritual experiences?
