Easter Reflection

Last Sunday, in Sri Lanka, as Christians went to church to celebrate the Resurrection of Jesus, as tourists sat to eat their meal, the Churches and hotels in Colombo were rocked by multiple bomb blasts as 8 suicide bombers detonated their explosive devices causing havoc and over 300 people lost their lives. A tragedy that we cannot comprehend. The tragedy on Calvary was transformed on Easter morning into Life, as Jesus rose again. In His resurrection Jesus invites us to receive the gift of eternal Life, forgiveness and grace. In the churches of Sri Lanka the children were celebrating with joy, and suddenly in the blink of an eye were gazing into the face of the One who they were celebrating. What joy for them but sadness for the survivors and injured, loved ones ripped away from their families.

But even in the midst of this grim tragedy there is the message of hope. One of the Sunday School teachers asked the children "How many of you would be ready to die for Christ." Everyone raised their hands. Minutes later they came down to the main service and the blast happened. 22 of the children who had raised their hands died in that moment." Are you, the reader ready to die for Him? There is hope in Jesus our Lord. Let us not faint, or be weary but run with steadfast patience the race set before us with our eyes fixed on Jesus, who shines in resurrection glory, the one in whom our faith is begun and is brought to completion.

An Indian sister writes to the perpetrators, "Perhaps you didn't know that doing what you did, at the time and place you chose, it actually meant that the last words that escaped their lips were probably words of remembrance and praise of Jesus. Which is a noble end many Christians could only dream of." Jesus is Alive! He is Lord.
