Reverend Ian's Reflections

Healing Prayer Ministry

Jesus' ministry was in three parts preaching, teaching and healing. Each part is well documented in the gospels; along with the commission for his followers to go out and heal in his name with authority. Reflecting this the letter of James instructs the elders of the church to pray over the sick and anoint them with oil in the name of the Lord. (see James 5:14)

God has placed on my heart this need to pray and anoint the sick. Not everyone in need of healing prayer has a physical condition, for many it is a spiritual condition deep in the soul. Possibly a struggle with relationships, an insecurity because of being let down or betrayed. Maybe something is causing the heart to harbour resentment, unforgiveness or bitterness.

Prayer ministry is where members of the body of Christ assist those wanting prayer to come into freedom from the sickness in their lives, by going deeper together towards Jesus in the power of the Holy Spirit. There is an opportunity to share needs with the prayer ministers or silently before God, you will then spend a time together in prayer seeking God's healing to restore you to wholeness in mind, body and spirit. Some find the peace they need simply by sitting in the presence of the Lord. There is an excitement and expectancy that as we worship and pray that we will encounter the true love of God the Father, the deep intimacy of Jesus and the true power of the Holy Spirit.

"Draw near to God and He will draw near to you." James 4:8

Come join us with expectation to encounter Jesus in times of praise, prayer and healing.
