Rector's Reflection

Candlemas, the feast celebrating the presentation of Christ in the temple. Officially in the Church calendar this feast ends the Christmas season.

Mary and Joseph bring Jesus into the temple to fulfil the righteousness of the law by presenting Him together with a prescribed offering. This offering was a redemption price to buy back their "son" who belonged to Yahweh.

In the temple they met Simeon who was a man filled with the Spirit and waiting for the coming of the Messiah. God's promise to him was that he would not taste death till he saw the Lord's anointed one. Guided by the Holy Spirit, Simeon came to the temple and when he saw Jesus and reached out and held Him. He then spoke the words that revealed Jesus as the saviour of the world. "My eyes have seen your salvation" he said.

Consider the parallels with Jesus' baptism. When He entered the waters of baptism he did it to fulfil the righteousness of the law. John who was baptising Him, in other words holding him under the water spoke this testimony, "Behold, the Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world."

Consider another momentous event. The scene is the mount called Calvary. Jesus the Saviour of the world, the Lamb of God hangs there dying we are told, as the sacrifice for our sins. The testimony this time as the centurion who witnessed His death gave this statement, "Truly this was the Son of God." Matt 27.54

Today when Jesus comes into our lives to fulfil the law of righteousness, what testimony do you think you will be able to give of Him? We point to Jesus who is our Saviour and redeemer. May the righteousness of Jesus be fulfilled in me and in you. May our testimony flow in praise of Him.
